Lyrical Drama Live-Streamed with Live Audience

Staatsoper Stuttgart presents Jules Massenet's *Werther* in a production by Felix Rothenhäusler as the first opera premiere with audience since October last year.

Jules Massenet's *Werther*, directed by Felix Rothenhäusler and team (Set Designer: Katharina Pia Schütz, Costume Designer: Elke von Sivers) will be performed on the stage of the Stuttgart's historic opera house on <u>Sunday</u>, July <u>112021 at 5:00pm CET</u>, in front of an audience of up to 700 people. The premiere, originally planned for autumn last year, will also be <u>broadcast as a live-stream</u>. The title role of Werther will be sung by internationally acclaimed tenor Arturo Chacón-Cruz, ensemble member Rachael Wilson will make her role debut as Charlotte. Further role debuts will be made by Paweł Konik (Albert), Shigeo Ishino (The Bailiff) and Aoife Gibney (Sophie). Staatsorchester Stuttgart under the direction of Marc Piollet will perform on the stage, rather than in the orchestra pit. Additionally, the Staatsoper Stuttgart Children's Chorus will sing. The live-stream is made possible by LBBW, the digital partner of Staastoper Stuttgart.

Johann Wolfgang von Goethe's *The Sorrows of Young Werther* from 1774 is known as an autobiographical collection of letters, as well as a tragic influencer of suicide. French composer Jules Massenet reinterpreted this "trendsetter text" that transformed an entire European generation more than 100 years after it was written: with exuberantly emphatic music, he portrays Werther as an emotional terrorist, whose love and eventual obsession for Charlotte leads to tragedy.

"Massenet makes everything more direct in his opera, he highlights Werther, lets the characters collide in their isolation. The opera is the phase of love that becomes radical. She wants to be nothing but that, and beyond that she does not create a social tableau, there is nothing but the desire, the radical search for a single figure, "says director Felix Rothenhäusler.

With his team and conductor Marc Piollet, Rothenhäusler has created a musical and scenic space that throws Werther and Charlotte into an arena of emotional frenzy that underlines the intensity and drama that we dream to experience in theatre.

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Felix Rothenhäusler has been in-house director at the Playhouse at Theater Bremen since the 2012/13 season, where he has staged contemporary novels and series material as well as classical works. In recent years he has also been increasingly active in opera theatre, working on productions of *Le nozze di Figaro* and *Die Fledermaus* at the Bremen Theater.

Marc Piollet was General Music Director of the Hessisches Staatstheater Wiesbaden from 2004 to 2012 and works with major ensembles and renowned opera houses around the world. From 2007 to 2010 he was a guest at the Stuttgart State Opera and conducted productions by *Jenůfa* and *Duke Bluebeard's Castle*, among others. Most recently, he took over the musical direction of *Hoffmann's Stories* in 2019.
