The power of transformation

Ukrainian conductor Oksana Lyniv and stage director Bastian Kraft work on Antonín Dvořák's *Rusalka* at the Staatsoper Stuttgart

Under the musical direction of Ukrainian conductor Oksana Lyniv, Antonín Dvořák's opera *Rusalka* will celebrate its premiere at the Staatsoper Stuttgart on 4 June at 6 pm. Ensemble member Esther Dierkes debuts in the title role, Goran Jurić can be experienced as Merman. David Junghoon Kim makes a guest appearance as the Prince, Allison Cook as the Foreign Princess and Katia Ledoux as Ježibaba. Director Bastian Kraft brings the new production to the stage with nationally well-known drag performers: the roles of the forest and water creatures are simultaneously interpreted by drag artists such as Reflektra, Alexander Cameltoe, Judy LaDivina or the Stuttgart drag queen Vava Vilde.

The motif of the mermaid Rusalka's longing for transformation, taken from Dvořák's fairy tale opera, can be found in many narrative variations from the Middle Ages to the present. Many of these stories, such as H.C. Andersen's Little Mermaid, the myth of Melusine or Disney's Arielle, have been interpreted through queer readings as portrayals of secretive lives and the pain associated with it. Following this thought, director Bastian Kraft places drag artists alongside the singers who are cast as the hybrid forest and water creatures. Through their performance of gender, which relies on fantasy and fluidity, they counteract a world thoroughly obsessed with fixed role models thus enabling a reflection on how the world could look like if difference no longer meant incompatibility.

With Rusalka, Bastian Kraft makes his opera debut at the Staatsoper Stuttgart. After assisting as stage director at the Burgtheater in Vienna, he continued to work in Vienna, Stuttgart and Frankfurt, at the Schauspielhaus Zurich, the Deutsche Theater Berlin and Thalia Theater Hamburg, among others. In 2019, he already staged *Ugly Duckling*, based on texts by H. C. Andersen, with actors and drag queens at Deutsche Theater Berlin.

Oksana Lyniv is internationally sought-after concert and opera conductor. She was also the first female conductor at the Bayreuth Festival in 2021 with *Der fliegende Holländer*. In 2022, Lyniv was appointed general music director at the Teatro Communale in Bologna.
