In the 2022/23 season, the Staatsoper Stuttgart will continue to let different worlds and passions meet and embark on a journey throughout the City: As one of the central new productions, Olivier Messiaen's opera Saint François d'Assise will be experienced as a musical procession within the city of Stuttgart. Der Ring des Nibelungen will conclude with Siegfried and Götterdämmerung offering cyclical performances in March and April 2023. Other new productions include Gaetano Donizetti's L'elisir d'amore and Johann Sebastian Bach's Passion of St. John, directed by Ulrich Rasche. Once again, the Staatsoper Stuttgart cooperates with pop and rap artists. In addition, Der Klang der Offenbarung des Göttlichen, directed by Ragnar Kjartansson and composed by Icelandic postrock musician Kjartan Sveinsson, will have its Stuttgart premiere. To a greater extent than ever before, family performances are offered with 10-euro tickets for children on offer on all seats.

New productions and conclusion of Der Ring des Nibelungen

A centrepiece of the new season will be the premiere of Olivier Messiaen's *Saint François d'Assise* in a production by **Anna-Sophie Mahler**. The eight pictures of the work will be presented under the musical direction of **Titus Engel** at various locations in the city: in as well as in front of the opera house, in Stuttgart's Schlossgarten and on the open-air stage of Höhenpark Killesberg. **Michael Mayes** takes on the role of Saint François, **Beate Ritter** embodies the Angel, **Moritz Kallenberg** the Leper. In addition to the Staatsorchester Stuttgart, the Staatsopernchor Stuttgart will also join the cast for this monumental score.

Richard Wagner's *Ring des Nibelungen*, under the musical direction of General Music Director **Cornelius Meister**, continues with *Siegfried* in October 2022. The

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1999 production will be re-staged by the directorial team **Jossi Wieler** and **Sergio Morabito** in Stuttgart. The production thus adds yet another perspective to the multi-perspectivity of the current *Ring*. The cast includes **Daniel Brenna** as Siegfried and ensemble members **Matthias Klink** (Mime), **David Steffens** (Fafner) and **Simone Schneider** (Brünnhilde). They all will debut in these roles.

The tetralogy will conclude with Marco Štorman's Götterdämmerung in January 2023, featuring Daniel Kirch as Siegfried and Christiane Libor as Brünnhilde. Patrick Zielke takes on both the roles of Hagen and Alberich. The other roles are taken by ensemble members Shigeo Ishino (Gunter), Esther Dierkes (Gutrune) and Stine Marie Fischer (Waltraute), among others. The Staatsopernchor Stuttgart is also involved. The entire *Ring* will be performed as a cycle in March and April.

At the beginning of the season, Stuttgart's long-time stage manager and RING AWARD winner **Anika Rutkofsky** will stage **L'elisir d'amore** by Gaetano Donizetti. With the exception of Dulcamara by **Giulio Mastrototaro**, all roles are cast with members from the soloist ensemble or the International Opera Studio, including **Claudia Muschio** as Adina, **Kai Kluge** as Nemorino and the Staatsopernchor Stuttgart with **Michele Spotti** as musical director.

Ulrich Rasche's production of Johann Sebastian Bach's *Passion of St John* will celebrate its premiere on Palm Sunday. Baroque specialist **Diego Fasolis** will take on the musical direction, with ensemble member **Moritz Kallenberg** as the Evangelist. In further roles **Shigeo Ishino** (as Jesus) and Andreas Wolf (as Peter/Pilate) amongst others. Another central role is given to the Staatsopernchor Stuttgart.

For the first time in Stuttgart, *Der Klang der Offenbarung des Göttlichen* is an "opera in four parts" that had its world premiere at Berlin Volksbühne in 2014. Artist **Ragnar Kjartansson** is responsible for the direction and stage concept. The music is by the Icelandic composer **Kjartan Sveinsson**, founding member of the well-known rock band **Sigur Rós**. The work can best be described as symphony with tableaux vivants for large orchestra and choir.

Repertoire

Returning to the stage are *Katja Kabanova* by Jossi Wieler and Sergio Morabito, *Carmen* alternating with ensemble members Rachael Wilson and Stine Marie Fischer in the title role and under the musical direction of Julia Jones, *La Cenerentola* with Diana Haller as Angelina, *Falstaff* under the musical direction of Friedrich Haider and *Das Lied von der Erde* in David Hermann's production. Furthermore *Platée, Le nozze di Figaro, Werther, Tosca, Don Giovanni* and *II barbiere di Siviglia* continue as part of the repertoire. Cornelius Meister takes on the musical direction of *Rusalka* and *Hänsel und Gretel*.

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
